


Heat Map of Recent Evictions in Multnomah County




□ Multnomah County Line

Portland Tenants United has compiled a database of 216 evictions in Multnomah County, Oregon, in the last month. With the eviction addresses mapped, spatial analysis methods created a heat map based on eviction concentrations. The analysis reveals the most severe cluster in downtown Portland over to the east bank of the Willamette River and another hotspot in the eastern suburbs near Rockwood.

Rate of Evictions in Multnomah County Census Block Groups




Portland Tenants United has compiled a database of 216 evictions that have occurred in the last month.

Multnomah County has 520 inhabited census block groups ranging in population from 531 to 5,181 people. 114 of these 520 census block groups have suffered an eviction that has been mapped. The number of evictions per census block group in this category ranged from one to seven.

This map depicts the per capita number of evictions in the census block groups. The darker reds show the areas with highest rates of per capita eviction. The census block group with the most per capita evictions (1 eviction per 291 people) experienced 4 recent evictions from a total population of 1,164.

Number of Evictions and Nonwhite Populations in Multnomah County Census Block Groups

This map displays all the census block groups that had at least one eviction. It shades each area by the percentage of the non-white population and provides a proportional symbol representing the number of evictions. It allows map readers to quickly spot census block groups with disproportionate displacement in areas with BIPOC concentrations.
